Red Flags Validated By Research

- Access to a firearm
- Prior threats with a firearm
- Whirlwind courtship/relationship
- Perpetrator unemployed or underemployed
- Stepchildren in the home
- Escalated threats of suicide
- Estrangement/Separation from victim

- Prior strangulation attempts
- Violation of protection orders
- Stalking/Monitoring
- Perpetrator's possessiveness of victim
- Threats to kill victim
- Threats to kill victim's children, family members, friends, etc.
- Significant Losses

 - loss of contact/custody regarding children
 - perceived loss of control
 - loss of coping mechanisms
- History of drug/alcohol use/abuse
- Believes/knows victim is pregnant
